Formal Visitation to the Parish

The Church wardens received confirmation last Friday of a formal visitation to the Parish. The official announcement that the Diocese asked us to give is as follows:

“Bishop Stephen has asked Tim Thornton, the recently retired Bishop of Lambeth, to conduct an in-depth enquiry into matters of concern within the Parish – many of which have been going on for several years. The enquiry will take place in September and the findings will be reported back to the Bishop with recommendations as to the way ahead for the Parish and all the individuals involved, including Charlie and his family. The aim is to achieve an outcome that promotes the common good and builds the Kingdom of God in our midst”.

When the Church wardens know more about the procedure, they will let everyone know.

(Bishop Tim will be meeting with Charlie on 6th September).
